From Father Chuck's Desk...When you want to remember something important what do you do? You might imagine that priests, just like parents and those whose vocations or careers, are challenged with many unexpected events throughout the day. Most of us have distractions from what we may have intended at the beginning of the day. I try to remember things by writing notes to myself, asking staff for reminders, and including the main tasks and the people and concerns of the day in my prayers. Even a mistake or an oversight can help to refine how we do things better in the future.

How we remember things is possibly a helpful consideration in defining our spiritual journey. We don't say to ourselves: "well I'll just stop in at the dentist office to have my teeth cleaned." Without an appointment we shouldn't expect to be seen right at that moment. We shouldn't look at our kitchen floor's sticky spot where juice was spilled and just say: "Oh if God wants me to have a clean floor without ants, it will just happen without my mopping it." We recognize needs, plan for important tasks, and prioritize our concerns with our available time. How we keep up with health, finances, family and friends, our work and our home is how we will succeed in our relationship with God in the Church. Small steps in regular increments, attention to timing and "what works for us" is a plan for a healthy spirituality just as it is for getting good grades in school, having a healthy body, having a clean, organized home and being effective in our work.

The world as we live in it now is God's gift. The people who are a regular part of our life, the amount of energy we have for each day, our strains and struggles, even our hopes and dreams are fully known to God. Our spirituality needs to be woven into the whole of our life. Opening our mail, caring for our health, keeping track of savings, keeping up with the news, and all the ways we spend our life energy has spiritual implications. We need to pray for God's guidance throughout the day and include the sacramental life of the Church in every component of our lives.

FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION begins in the parish hall on October 11, following the 9:00 AM Mass . At least one parent(guardian) is expected to join us in the hall for registration of their child/children and a presentation on family expectations. It is imperative that all families with children between kindergarten and 5th grade attend this October 11 session. *Parents, when you had your child baptized you made a promise to ensure the proper formation in the faith of your children.* This formation does not end when your child is confirmed.
