From Father Chuck's Desk...We learn from studying the Gospels that some people listened to Jesus and some people did not. Some had a strong desire that Jesus should be a certain way, waited for a while hoping that He would fit their desired image, and then abandoned Him in disappointment. Some people actually began to hate Him right from the beginning. It seems that the only people who ever could consistently love Jesus and those who can today are those who are ready to change. The virtue in being "poor in spirit" is that disposition of openness to the movement of the Holy Spirit in our lives by which we hear and follow God's Word. The rich young man walks away from Jesus' invitation because he does not want to change and cannot imagine life without his material possessions. What is in the way of our proper response to Jesus' invitation in our life? We hear His urgent warning in the Gospel today that we must repent. We know that we have been born into a world that is constantly changing, yet we rarely like to change. We embrace by faith that we have eternal life by God's providence through Jesus Christ. At the end of our life on earth we shall, by God's mercy, enjoy the changeless splendor of heaven. Furthermore, we have the Eucharist and the Sacraments of the Church to sustain us as we struggle and suffer in this life. When we behold the Body and Blood of Christ we all say that we are unworthy and that God alone can heal us. We are invited to learn and to change as Christian disciples by the power of the Holy Spirit, to grow through the sacramental life of the Church and to love one another along our journey. May we desire repentance enough to seek and find it during this season of Lent.

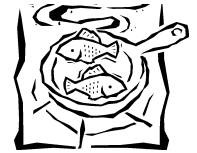
