**PATHWAYS 2010-2011** The lifelong formation of all the faithful is necessary so that the Church can effectively witness to and carry forth the mission of Christ. For 15 years, the Diocese of Greensburg has responded to this need by sponsoring PATHWAYS, a faith formation course developed specifically for the adult Catholic. PATHWAYS is an opportunity for men and women to develop a better understanding of the Catholic faith, to grow in discipleship and to be better equipped to witness to and share the Good News of Jesus Christ. The Office for Lay Ecclesial Ministry announces that PATHWAYS 2010-2011 will be offered at two sites. Classes will be held Tuesday evenings at St. Joseph Church, Uniontown and Thursday evenings at Our Lady of Grace Parish, Greensburg. There are 12 evening sessions (6/Oct-Nov 2010 and 6/March-April 2011). There is also a day-long opening workshop on Saturday, October 2, 2010 and 2 Saturday morning workshops and a closing retreat. All materials are provided. Brochures and registration forms are available at the parish and on-line at the diocesan website. The fee is \$125. Financial assistance from the Francis Fund is available. *From Father Chuck's Desk...We join the world in celebrating the limitless love of God made manifest in Jesus Christ and in His victory over sin and death as we begin the season of Easter. We celebrate this wonderful mystery together as a parish in a diocese connected to the universal Church that traces itself to Jesus' commissioning of Peter until His return. We celebrate Easter in a world that has made great strides in science, medicine, and international policy, but seems to have changed very little in the areas of justice, peace, civil rights, the dignity of the human person, just wages for work, and honesty in political rhetoric, among other things. We pray for a world that still over-reacts in violence to political tensions and mistrust of the stranger just as it did when Jesus was among us in His public ministry. None of us is able to remain hopeful on our own when we know that so much can change and so little has; thanks be to God that the Holy Spirit strengthens us to live in anticipation of what we cannot yet see. None of us is able to rise to the occasion of our faith to love, forgive and pray for our enemies on our own; thanks be to God that the sacramental life of the Church empowers us to believe in God's all-sufficient grace. Easter reminds us that Jesus was ill-received in His time but shared our humanity fully in spite of its pain. Easter reminds us that the unlikely, often weak and confused disciples were able, by their love and perseverance, to create the foundation for our Church of now millions and millions of people over two thousand years. Easter reminds us that in a world still filled with injustice, intolerance, hatred, terrorism, unjust war and unnecessary poverty, simple faith, open hearts and minds and generous spirits are even now changing the face of the earth. May the Easter light inspire us to ask the Lord to give us the courage, faith, hope, love, and perseverance to work hard to foster the peace of Christ in the world into which God has placed us to do His work in our own time. May the joy of Easter fill our hearts with all we need to overcome our fears, resentments and frustrations and to live the Gospel in such a way that we lead others to follow our Savior.*

*Christ is risen! He is truly risen! Bless us, Father, with the assurance of your Son's risen presence in our lives, for Jesus is our Lord, now and for ever. Amen.*
