From Father Chuck's Desk...All who come to Mass at Church of the Good Shepherd can see depictions of Christ at four moments in His humanity. We can see him as an infant in the arms of St. Joseph. In the statue of Jesus as a child we are invited to celebrate, with Simeon and Anna, the fulfillment of God's plan of the Incarnation and the hope and joy of salvation. In the wooden relief carving we see Jesus as the Good Shepherd in his public ministry and authoritative teaching for Israel and the Gentiles as the promised Messiah. In the carving above the altar of his body on the cross we rejoice in the depth of God's love for us and the perfect sacrifice of Jesus the Priest and Lamb of God. In our Easter statue of Jesus Resurrected we are asked to believe in what we cannot yet understand, that Jesus is the first who experiences resurrection and that God wants us to live our faith in Christ to its fullness so that we are free from sin and worthy of resurrection in eternal life when He returns in glory at the end of time.

We have been given a precious gift; our Christian faith is the pearl of great price that we are called to cherish above all else. We must be willing to get rid of anything that harms or weakens our faith. Meditating on the whole of Jesus' human life among us is the means by which we can distinguish between what we are doing and what with God's grace we are capable of. We remember that when God in Christ Jesus assumes our humanity, we are given a new dignity and the capacity, by the Holy Spirit whom He sends into the Church, to be holy. Each of us must recognize that we have been given a task that, without the strength we receive in the sacramental life of the Church, we cannot fulfill. Statues, icons, carvings and etchings of Jesus fill our church. These images of our Savior have a specific purpose; we have been blessed with faith in Christ who shows us that God loves us so much that He becomes one of us, dies for our sins and returns to show the first disciples that resurrection and eternal life await those who live out the call to serve in the name of the Lord. As we prepare to celebrate Pentecost, let us use the remaining days of the holy season of Easter to cherish the precious blessing of our Christian faith and our sacred calling to love and serve according to the example Jesus shows us in His humanity.

PENTECOST SUNDAY Next Sunday we conclude the Easter Season with the celebration of Pentecost, commemorating the Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles. To celebrate the birthday of the Church, you are encouraged to wear red when you come to Mass next weekend, since red is the color generally associated with the Holy Spirit.

2010 DIOCESAN LENTEN APPEAL
