From Father Chuck's Desk...As we celebrate Father's Day perhaps we might take a close look at the power of the virtue of gratitude. The meaning of Father's Day is appreciation for the men who have taken upon themselves the vocation of fatherhood. Saint Joseph is depicted in the Gospel as a holy man who quietly suffers from the ways that this vocation to fatherhood disrupts his life. Joseph accepts these difficulties and challenges with trust in God. Jesus consistently speaks to His disciples of doing the will of God the Father who sends the Son into our world. The work of confronting sin and abuse of the Covenant's law and prophets causes Jesus great suffering. No vocation is without suffering. I cherish the way that our Catholic Christian tradition blesses me with the name "Father Chuck," yet both before being ordained a priest and afterwards, I heard consistent testimony from priests who shared that some people who call themselves Catholic Christians are disrespectful toward priests. The greatest anger seems to erupt when priests need to challenge people to change. Few want the Church to change as a result of having fewer priests, for example, but we must all work to accept the results of fewer vocations even while we pray for more. No parents or ministers would be very successful at their vocation if they changed their decisions or policies every time someone expressed personal dislike of a specific decision. If we could have the courage to come directly to our fathers when we feel badly or have a request rather than speaking to others about what we don't like, we might gain new insight and be free of our resentment. Jesus was constantly urged to do things differently than the way He was called to do them and those who had power used it in an attempt to punish Jesus for following the will of God the Father. Whether through the blessing of children or by ordination, fathers are often spoken ill of, lashed out against, given the silent treatment, and are the recipients of many other negative, unkind, undeserved behaviors by some among those they are trying to serve. The ability to rise above the petty, look past the immature or pathetic, and stay steadfast at the task is what distinguishes those who live out these vocations well. Please pray for all fathers. May God heal our sinful tendency to resent authority and awaken us from our unrealistic expectations. Most young people dislike their father's choices sometimes; most wise people eventually see the error in those earlier feelings and can now be grateful.

Deadline for Applying for Diocesan Sponsorship for Certificate in Pastoral Ministry Program

This is a reminder that the deadline for applying for diocesan sponsorship to the Certificate in Pastoral Ministry program is Friday, July 2, 2010. A retreat for new students is scheduled for Saturday, August 21. The first course is scheduled for Thursday evenings and begins August 26. The certificate program is a joint venture of the Diocese and Seton Hill University. It is designed to prepare those called to lay ecclesial ministry to fulfill their responsibilities with theological competence, pastoral sensitivity and spiritual depth. The program also serves as a resource to the Office for the Permanent Diaconate. Men interested in applying to the diocesan permanent diaconate formation program must first be accepted into the certificate program.
