Deadline for Applying for Diocesan Sponsorship for Certificate in Pastoral Ministry Program

Deadline for applying for diocesan sponsorship to the Certificate in Pastoral Ministry program is this Friday, July 2, 2010. New students retreat is scheduled for Saturday, August 21. The first course is Thursday evenings and begins August 26. The certificate program is a joint venture of the Diocese & Seton Hill University. It is designed to prepare those called to lay ecclesial ministry to fulfill their responsibilities with theological competence, pastoral sensitivity and spiritual depth. The program also serves as a resource to the Office for the Permanent Diaconate. Men interested in applying to the diocesan permanent diaconate formation program must first be accepted into the certificate program. From Father Chuck's Desk...Jesus teaches his disciples to say in prayer to God: "Thy will be done." Our human freedom is God's gift. Perhaps we sometimes wish we had less freedom when we are in the midst of a dilemma or, even no freedom when we think about how we have sinned. God rarely interferes with our activities and never interferes with our intentions, so we are essentially free to sin in thought, word, deed or omission.

I think it's important to remember with humility that even our point of view is flawed and can lead us to sin. We will almost always feel comfortable with our attitudes on life and opinions about everyone and everything. Conveniently we rarely have a conflicted feeling about things if we want them. As disciples of Christ, however, we are called to seek the Lord's guidance and evaluate what leads to our decisions and behaviors. One of the first areas to consider is our will. As we reflect closely on the words of this special prayer that Jesus teaches us, we acknowledge that the will of God is to be done by the work we do and the lives we lead.

To pray for and be kind to those who have different views than we do is difficult, but necessary for us to bestow the respect we learn from Jesus that all people deserve. We also have a sacred responsibility to walk away from our tendency to judge others. We know that we cannot see into another person's heart, that we never have the whole story when we look at another person, and that Christ is the only proper judge of us all.

May our desire for holiness lead us to deepen the effect of our prayer life. May others see the humility that comes from rejoicing in our recognition of Christ as our Savior. May we be strong enough in character to be critical of our assumptions, point of view, and anything that leads us to the error of judging others. May God's will be done by our thoughts, words, and actions, that we may feel the peace of being in right relationship with God and our brothers and sisters in Christ.
