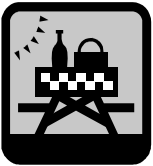
Each year in January you will receive an IRS letter from the Diocese Campaign Office indicating the amount of money you have paid toward the campaign the previous year.

Holy Water

Each time we enter the church we bless ourselves with holy water. That rite is meant to remind us of our Baptism. Baptism is the way that we became part of the community of the faithful. It was our entrance in church (the people of God). It was the way that God made us God's children, brothers and sisters of Jesus and of one another. So each time we enter the church we make that sign of our faith. The font or fonts at the entrance to the church contain holy water. It is the water that we use to renew our faith and the water we use to baptize. Those who use holy water as part of their family prayer can request water to take home.

From Father Chuck's Desk... When we think of how we succumb to our temptations, we might agree that forgetting is perhaps among the most powerful precursors to sinning. When we focus on our blessings with the intention to recall how much mercy we have received from God and how much patience we have received for example, we might gain strength to extend those virtues to others. If we forget how much we have been forgiven, however, we are more likely to proceed in being unkind or proud with others. If we remember what exceptional blessings we have in this nation: rich natural resources, diverse climates, and a government which protects civil liberties, including our freedom to live out our faith, we might more earnestly ponder how we can be generous with those who are in need nearby and throughout the world. If we remember how many mentors we have had in our lives we are more likely to be able to willingly help others, to participate in the corporal works of mercy, and be less judgmental when we must deal with someone who has not had sufficient guidance. Remembering that we have felt bad when someone ridiculed us or when we learned that someone was gossiping or making up stories about us can help us to resist when we are bored or otherwise have the opportunity to entertain ourselves at someone else's expense. Forgetting who we are seems pathetic and yet, when we sin we are doing just that. When we are rude, selfish, or sinful in any way we are forgetting God's love and mercy, that we have been redeemed by Christ and blessed with the abiding presence of the Holy Spirit in the sacramental life of the Church. May all we are, including our memory and our will, be directed to the goal of being a blessing to others, a neighbor to the needy, and a faithful servant of the Lord always.
