From Father Chuck's Desk... Since we are in the midst of Ordinary Time in the Church calendar I would like to encourage us to ponder the constantly extraordinary presence of God in our lives. I have been encouraged by the reports people have been giving me recently of their experiences on retreats. The simplicity of the atmosphere in churches and in places for retreats helps us to focus on the deeper issues of our life, especially on our spirituality. Distractions come in many forms. We may even welcome them because they enable us to have an "excuse" for not tending to hurts we need to resolve and sins for which we need to atone. There are many important issues in our families, our places of work, and in the community that require our attention. None of them, however, are "good enough" excuses for disregarding the unresolved injuries we have caused. Furthermore, we have an important responsibility to regularly be in a place—mentally as well as physically—where we can be attentive to our relationship with God. The extraordinary beauty of our world, the wonder of how we have been created, the blessings of our world and the people in our lives are all aspects of our experience to reflect upon and to be thankful for. We are oblivious to the hand of God in our lives if we allow ourselves to be too busy. We are also on the wrong path if we are seeking God only in visions or the paranormal. God is always available to us in the ordinary routine of our miraculous lives. We are called to place ourselves in God's presence by centering ourselves in prayer before we begin an activity, before and after we eat, when we have a good night's sleep or a positive doctor's report, or just when looking up at the sky or hearing the chirping of birds lightens our spirits. Above all we are called to show the world how important we hold our opportunity to experience the wonderful blessing of the sacramental life of the Church by how we make Mass a priority and cherish rest, family and friends especially on Sundays. For Catholic Christians miracles abound in the splendor of ordinary life. May the depth of our faith lead others to this way of experiencing the world God has made.
