*From Father Chuck's Desk...I find it interesting that so much of the world seems to pivot on the academic calendar. From the state and federal legislature to businesses and the level of participation at Mass, everyone makes plans around the school year and chooses to "recess" somewhat for parts of the summer. Maybe it's helpful to remember that we are each called to a lifelong pursuit formation and catechesis. The word "disciple" means "student." We are disciples of Christ as members of the Church and can expect our faith to stagnate and wither if we don't seek new ways to understand God's Word. Christ teaches us that the law is fulfilled when we love the Lord with all our heart, all our mind, and all our strength, and to love our neighbor as ourselves. In order to love our neighbor as Jesus demonstrates it in the Gospel we must fight the temptation to disregard those we decide to dislike or to withhold forgiveness from those who have offended us. We must also seek ways to allow the Holy Spirit to enter our minds and hearts so that we are using our skills and talents to their fullest potential. We learn from mistakes as well as from encouraging compliments we receive if we have the disposition of a disciple. When we want to learn we are capable of learning. When the desire to have a heart capable of great love meets with regular time spent with God in prayer we are able to love more. The spiritual virtues, like physical strength and mental capacity, generally become stronger with use. As the new school year approaches, we might recognize the opportunity to recommit ourselves to be holy disciples of Christ, hungry for the gifts of the Holy Spirit, interested in learning more about our faith, willing to spend ourselves in service of God and our neighbor, and humble enough to admit where we need to grow.*

The Celebrating Assembly

We listen. We respond. We are sent. If we understand these steps as an assembly, we will better understand what it means to say the Sunday Mass is not a private act, but something we all do together. It is in this sense that we say that we are all celebrants. A worshipping community that begins to believe in itself and act as God's priestly people will unleash tremendous power for life. It is through that faith experience that God touches us and we touch God. If we actively work at the task of being an assembly, then we will see what a difference that can make.
