



#### From Fr. Matthew's Desk

<u>Lenten Obligations</u>—Throughout the upcoming Season of Lent, we are called to make extra effort in three areas of life: Prayer, Penance, and Almsgiving—all three practices are practices of *denying ourselves* so that we can *grow in charity toward others*. Two practices are **obligatory** for Latin Rite Catholics (Eastern Rite Catholics have their own practices):

- Fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, defined as no more than one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. This is binding for all, ages 18-59.
- **Abstinence** on Ash Wednesday and *all Fridays of Lent*, total abstinence from all meat (red meat, poultry). This is binding for all, age 14 onwards.

When we enter into these obligatory penances, they should be done in a spirit of penance (e.g. an all-you-can-eat lobster buffet obeys the letter of the law, though not the spirit of it).

In addition, we should consider taking on voluntary penitential practices. Stations of the Cross takes place at the Parish twice each week. There are various Missions and Conferences throughout the Diocese during Lent. All are encouraged to donate to the Diocesan Lenten Appeal (more info in upcoming weeks). The CRS Rice Bowl (bowls available in the Narthex) reminds us how the food we give up in Lent helps provide for needs of others. Prayer books for adults and children are available in the Narthex as well. Let us make use of all of these things to help us enter into Lent in a way that it bears fruit.

<u>Sarris Candy Orders Due</u>—Please make sure your Sarris Candy Orders are dropped off in the box in the Narthex THIS WEEKEND. If for some reason you can't drop them off by Sunday Mass, please drop them off in the milk box by the Office some time on Sunday.

<u>Volunteers Still Needed for Lenten Dinners</u>—For our Lenten Dinners to be successful, we must have enough volunteers to make everything work. Please consider volunteering for our Dinners as part of your Lenten sacrifices. Please sign up on the sign-up sheet in the Narthex. If we have enough volunteer commitment to sustain both dine-in and drive-thru, then we will begin advertising both for later dinners. -

<u>Mass Offerings</u>—We are running low on Mass intentions for our Daily Masses. Please consider offering a Mass for someone or some intention. Suggested donation is \$10. Masses can be offered for the deceased *or* for the living. Forms for Mass intentions (beige) are in the Narthex and in the Parish Office.



Registration is now open for KNOW HIM: The Last Supper and the Gift of the Eucharist, set for Thursday, March 9, at 2 and 6 p.m. at Christ Our Shepherd Center, Greensburg. This experiential event begins with a prayer service led by Bishop Larry J. Kulick, followed by a keynote address regarding the gift of the Eucharist from Monsignor Raymond E. Riffle, Vicar General of the Diocese of Greensburg and Rector of Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, Greensburg. Afterward, attendees will make their way through the rooms at Christ Our Shepherd Center for an unforgettable Eucharistic journey. One room will feature a life-sized print of The Last Supper mural created by Italian Renaissance artist Leonardo da Vinci, along with an explanation of its scriptural nuances from art historian Liz Lev, a former didactic consultant for the Vatican Museums, who recorded a special talk on the subject for the Diocese of Greensburg from Rome. Another room will feature Monsignor Michael J. Begolly, Pastor of Mother of Sorrows Parish, Murrysville, discussing his recent pilgrimage to the Holy Land and preparing to receive the Eucharist. Father Christopher J. Pujol, Parochial Vicar of Blessed Sacrament Cathedral Parish, will lead a discussion and demonstration

in another room about the significance of washing feet. Bishop Kulick himself will discuss the bread of life and the symbolism of Easter bread while guests sample paska bread. 
