


The Sanctuary Candle is lit in memory of Michael Rayko, Sr. by Norbert & Barbara Rayko.

From Fr. Matthew's Desk

Dying to Self in Lent—

We begin our Lenten journey in the wilderness with Jesus as He undertakes a 40-day fast. At the end of the fast, the devil tempts Him with temptations to bodily comforts in food, to presume in the Father's protection by hurling Himself from the Temple, and to power through false worship. Jesus overcomes these in His humanity through the period of preparation in prayer and fasting. Even so, this fast was difficult—it hurt—it was a dying to self.



In Lent, this is what our renunciation of sin along with our prayer, fasting (penance) and almsgiving point us toward. It is practicing to die before we die. Our Lenten readings and prayers underscore that the wages of sin is death—and that death entered the world through Original Sin. Death is the great equalizer and, in the eyes of the world, unavoidable. But this manner of practicing to die in the manner Christ did also prepares us for something Satan didn't expect—Christ would conquer both sin and death by His Cross and His Resurrection. By dying to those things that separate us from Christ (sin) and obstruct our journey toward holiness (worldly temptations), we empty our hands to embrace redeemed life in Christ that we celebrate at Easter and will have the fullness of at the end of time. If you die before you die, when you die you will not die.

<u>Lenten Dinners</u>—Keep spreading the word about our Famous Lenten Dinners. Fridays 4-7. Drive-through only for the time being. If you need more posters please ask in the Parish Office.

<u>Mass Offerings</u>—We are running low on Mass intentions for our Daily Masses. Please consider offering a Mass for someone or some intention. Suggested donation is \$10. Masses can be offered for the deceased *or* for the living. Forms for Mass intentions (beige) are in the Narthex and in the Parish Office.
