

From Fr. Dino's Desk

Fourth Sunday of Lent Reflection

March 10. Texts: 2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23, Ps. 137:1-2, 3, 4-5, 6, Eph. 2:4-10, Jn. 3:14-21.

How have I experienced love? How devastating it is for a child to grow up without knowing love! We human beings need love to become whole. Without the experience of loving one another, how can we come to experience God's love for us?

The Second Reading also reveals "the great love [God] had for us." Further, while the second reading affirms that we are "saved through faith," it also makes clear that this faith itself "is the gift of God. More love!"

Such depth of God's love this Gospel reveals: God gave the only; Son, allowed the only Son to be "lifted up" on a cross, and now remains patient with us while we struggle with choosing between darkness and light, evil and truth. Moreover, in the very midst of our ongoing struggle, it is God who brings us to greater belief and leads us to eternal life. Such is the depth of love God has for us!

Rooted in the history of the Eucharistic Congress, CRS Rice Bowl invites Catholics and faith communities in the United States to encounter God and our global family throughout Lent by practicing the pillars of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Lenten alms donated through CRS Rice Bowl support the work of CRS in more than 120 different countries each year. Twenty-five percent of donations to CRS Rice Bowl stay in the local diocese, supporting hunger and poverty alleviation efforts. Since its inception in 1975, CRS Rice Bowl has raised more than \$330 million.
