





From Fr. Matthew's Desk

<u>Rejoice!</u>—Today is Laetare Sunday, roughly the halfway point of our Lenten season, with the name taken from the first words of the proper entrance antiphon for today's Mass:

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast. (Is. 66:10-11)

This joy is a bit different than the sense of joy we have the other time we encounter rose vestments, on Gaudete Sunday in Advent. If we read the passage in its context of Isaiah's prophecy, we would see that this call to rejoice as those who had remained faithful or returned in fidelity to God's previous Covenants were comforted through the Gentile nations coming to believe in the God of Israel. In other words, it is a glimpse forward to the mysteries we celebrate in our Easter Season—Jesus creating a new Covenant in the course of the Last Supper together with His Death and Resurrection, as well as the spreading of the message of His Resurrection through the newborn Church.

Let this joy inspire you—though the works of Lent are long, they prepare us for this coming joy. Our true destination is Heaven, where we may see all of these things in their fullness. The penances and prayers we take on are the way that we condition ourselves, so that when the time has come we are fully prepared!

St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store, 4th St., Indiana







Talk #1 Born From Above

This presentation will unpack our Lord's conversation with a Scholar of the Old Testament Scriptures, Nicodemus, in John chapter three. Despite all his studies, Nicodemus still could not understand the ways of God. Jesus came to help him see that it was impossible to see God's Kingdom because he was lacking something. 
