

From Fr. Matthew's Desk

<u>Community Sports News</u>—Congratulations to the Girls' Basketball teams of Homer Center HS and River Valley HS—both teams advanced to the PIAA State Championship games for their respective divisions to be held in Hershey this weekend. This is only the 3rd and 4th time any team from Indiana County has gone to the State Title Game. As of time of publishing, we don't know how everything will turn out, but we are proud of all their hard work to have done so well.

<u>Passiontide and Palm Sunday</u>—This Sunday marks the beginning of Passiontide—the last phase of Lent, which focuses more closely on the approaching of the Passion and Death of Christ. I encourage you to take advantage of the opportunities to draw nearer to Christ during this time through liturgical devotions, public devotions, and private devotions. A copy of the schedule of Masses and events for the Triduum and Easter is available in the insert.

There are two relevant liturgical notes for next Sunday (Palm Sunday). First, Mass will begin in the back of the Church with the Blessing of Palms. I invite all those who are able to gather in the Narthex for this **blessing and the procession that follows**—as we process past your seat, feel free to break away from the procession into your place. Additionally, for Palm Sunday (and Good Friday) we read **an account of the Passion of Christ**, which is always very long. If you are unable to stand for the entirety of these readings (or any other long Gospel reading throughout the year), *please feel free to listen to the Gospel while seated.* While the gesture of standing for the Gospel is a sign of our respect for it, sitting out of necessity is not a sign of disrespect.

Pontifical Good Friday Collection for the Holy Land—The Gospel comes to life in a special way during Holy Week as we remember the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Each year on Good Friday, a collection is taken up to support Christians in the Holy Land to provide for their educational, spiritual, and physical needs, as well as to maintain the many ancient churches and holy sites there. The last several years have been particularly difficult for those Christians who give a living witness to our Faith in the Holy Land due to the decline in the number of pilgrims because of the pandemic, as well as because of ongoing political and social unrest. This collection allows us to demonstrate our solidarity together with them.



April 1/2: Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Vigil Mass April 1; 4:30 PM Sunday Mass April 2; 9:30 AM Both Masses will begin with blessing of palms and a procession from the Narthex

April 6: Holy Thursday

Chrism Mass @ Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, Greensburg—10:00 AM. At this Mass, Bishop Kulick blesses the oils used in Sacraments throughout the following year, and the priests of the Diocese renew the Priestly Promises of their Ordination.

7:00 PM — Mass of the Lord's Supper

Adoration at Altar of Repose in Social Hall following Mass until Night Prayer at 11:00 AM. Many other parishes in the region will also have Altars of Repose—Some people will travel between several churches to pray before the Blessed Sacrament.

April 7: Good Friday

8:30 AM — Stations of the Cross

2:00 PM—Service of the Lord's Passion

5:30 PM—"Watch and Pray" Prayer Service

"Burial of the Lord" Service at Our Lady of the Assumption, Lucernemines—7:00 PM—This service, unique to the Franciscan Tradition, is a re-enactment of the veneration of the Lord's Body and his entombment. A fitting commemoration of Good Friday, especially if you are unable to take part in the Service of the Lord's Passion earlier in the day.

April 8: Holy Saturday

8:30 AM — Morning Prayer followed by Church Decorating

12:00 Noon — Blessing of Easter Baskets

8:30 PM — Easter Vigil Mass

April 9: Easter Sunday



"For He has risen, just as He said!"

9:30 AM — Easter Sunday Mass

Children's Easter Egg Hunt following Mass—we will be outside if possible if there is not rain/snow; please dress for the weather!

The Parish Office will be CLOSED April 7—April 10 for the Paschal Triduum and Easter Monday. The office will reopen Tuesday, April 11. Mass schedule for Easter week will be in the Easter Bulletin.

Palm Sunday: Placing of Branches in the Home

The branches that are blessed and brought home on Palm Sunday are to be placed in a prominent place in the home. This may be on or near a Crucifix or an image of Jesus, near a copy of the Bible, or—if a the palm itself is folded into the shape of a cross—displayed by itself. This reminds us that Lent is the slow coming of spring to the earth, the renewal of life. They are like the great "Hosanna" with which we hail the crucified and risen Lord.

After dinner or at another time on Palm Sunday, the household gathers where the palms have been placed with the Cross or image and the Scriptures

All make the sign of the cross.

Leader: Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

All: Hosanna in the highest!

The Leader may use these or similar words to introduce the prayer:

Leader: We have come to the last days of Lent. Today we heard the reading of the Passion. That story will remain with us as we leave Lent behind on Holy Thursday and enter into the Three Days when we celebrate the mystery of Christ passing through suffering and death to life at God's right hand.

Then the Scripture (2 Cor. 4:10-11) is read:

Reader: A Reading from the Apostle Paul to the Corinthians.

[We are] always carrying about in the body the dying of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our body. For we who live are constantly being given up to death for the sake of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may be manifested in our mortal flesh.

The Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.


After a time of silence, members of the household may join in prayers of intercession, or a litany, such as Litany of the Holy Name of Jesus, may be prayed.

All pray the Lord's Prayer together

Leader: Let us pray. Blessed are you, God of Israel, so rich in love and mercy. Let these branches ever remind us of Christ's triumph. May we who bear them rejoice in his cross and sing your praise forever.

All: Amen.

Together all take the palms to the place where they will be kept through the coming year. The following hymn may be sung to a tune such as "The Old Hundredth" (Praise God



from Whom All Blessings Flow) or "Erhalt Uns Herr" (The Glory of These Forty Days), or may be recited.

O Sun of justice, Jesus Christ Dispel the darkness of our hearts Till your blest light makes nighttime flee And brings the joys your day imparts.

The day, your day in beauty dawns When in your light earth blooms anew; Led back again to life's true way, May we, forgiv'n rejoice in you.

Leader: Let us bless the Lord

All respond, making the sign of the cross:

All: Thanks be to God.


