

From Fr. Matthew's Desk

The Eucharist and the Nativity—For many, many years, there was an explicit connection made in the Liturgy between the mystery of the Eucharist celebrated on the feast of Corpus Christi and the mystery of the Nativity of Christ. Prior to the 1960s, the Preface of the Nativity (said prior to the Eucharistic Prayer) was used for the Mass of the Feast. In that preface, we are reminded that:

For in the mystery of the Word made flesh a new light of your glory has shone upon the eyes of our mind, so that, as we recognize in him God made visible, we may be caught up through him in love of things invisible.

This is incredibly appropriate for *this mystery of the Eucharist* that we celebrate this weekend—in the celebration of the Eucharist, Christ is again made present to us in a real way. However, this real way that Christ is present is not as a baby, but in the bread and wine transformed into His Body and Blood. In this way, we are caught up in loving Christ, invisibly hidden in the Blessed Sacrament, because we first loved Him in his coming as a child.

This also reminds us to look for Christ in other hidden, invisible ways. One of the major focuses of the Eucharistic Revival is to remind us that the Eucharist always drives us to *go outward* and to bring the Eucharist *out into the world*. The biggest way we do this is by encountering Christ in our brothers and sisters who are in need—those who are suffering, sad, or lonely, as well as in the poor and the marginalized. We see Christ suffering in them, and console that suffering through the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. As Jesus reminds us (in Matthew 25), whatever we do for the least of these brothers and sisters, we do it for Him.

In particular, thank you to all who planned the celebration after the weekend Masses last week, and to those who gave me gifts. I am constantly grateful for all of you here at Good Shepherd, and grateful to God for the last four years of being your pastor.


