

St. Gertrude (Nov. 16): Monastic, Mystic, Friend of Holy Souls in Purgatory

St. Gertrude was born in Germany in 1256. From the age of five, she was placed in the care and education of the Benedictine Nuns of Helfta; at a young age she chose to remain there and become a nun herself. There she devoted herself to prayer and studies, including the study of theology. She became known for her charm and ability to win hearts; this was particularly true for the relationship built with her life-long mentor and friend, St. Mechtilde. At the age of 25, Gertrude



began having mystical visions which continued throughout her life. This mystical journey affected a constant growth in holiness for Gertrude, lived outwardly in her exemplary practice of monastic life; she had begged of God that her rich mystical life not be made known through outward signs, although she was known for gifts of miracles and prophecy. Many of her writings are lost, but some still survive today.

St. Gertrude had a great sense of charity for both rich and poor, learned and simple, and this charity extended in a particular way to her tender sympathy for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. She had a great yearning for their perfection and completion of their journey to God—there are several prayers for the Holy Souls that are attributed to her.

St. Gertrude died on November 17, 1301—the virgin finally entering into the joy of her heavenly Bridegroom. She was canonized in 1677. St. Gertrude was patroness of our former Parish in McIntyre.



Next Week's Second Collection—Diocesan Poverty Relief Fund and Catholic Relief Services—Catholic Relief Services (CRS) is the official overseas relief and development agency of the USCCB; it serves those affected by humanitarian crises and natural disasters throughout the world. The Diocesan Poverty Relief Fund (DPRF) is used to provide grants to qualifying human services organizations in the four counties of our Diocese through direct assistance and providing humanitarian programs. This year, three-fourths of this collection remains in the Diocese—half to the DPRF, a quarter to Catholic Charities for direct assistance for heating fuel and utilities for the poor, and a quarter to CRS.


Notes for Thanksgiving

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren hosts monthly meetings

An increasing number of grandparents are unexpectedly thrust into the role of being the primary caregiver for children in need of family members (other than their parents) to provide a home due to opioid abuse, alcoholism, incarceration, divorce, child abuse or other reasons. One in 10 grandparents (often on fixed incomes) have been the primary support of a grandchild at some time in their lives. Our churches are concerned and are putting our faith into action through Grandparents Raising Grandchildren, an ecumenical social outreach mission of St. Cecilia Parish, Whitney, Sacred Heart Parish, Youngstown, and Trinity Lutheran Church, Latrobe. Monthly meetings offer grandparents useful information and time to interact with one another, which can serve as a form of venting or therapy. A hot dinner and child care are provided.
