The stained glass windows behind the tabernacle were refurbished last year, and we are in the process of restoring our baptismal font to working order. We look forward to using it as the threat of COVID-19 finally passes. After focusing on replacing the church roof in 2018, we also replaced the original rectory roof in 2020. This year also has seen ongoing



maintenance for the buildings and grounds, including some work to address drainage issues, ongoing improvement of the Good Shepherd Garden, and trimming the pin oak trees at the church entrance.

The most exciting projects are two that have been long in waiting and are finally under way — the demolition of the DeMaria house and accompanying outbuildings and the replacement of the four original HVAC units on the church.
