



From Fr. Dino's Desk

7th Sunday of Easter The Ascension of the Lord

June 1. Texts: Acts 7:55-60, Psalm 97:1-2, 6-7, 9, Revelation 22:12-14, 16-17, 20, John 17:20-26.

The Prayer We Resist: "That They May Be One".

Today's world is more characterized by division than by unity. We face off against each other as rich and poor. North and South, white and black, African and Asian, Jew and Arab, Christian and Jew, Catholic and Protestant, male and female, young and old, suburban and inner city, conservative and liberal.

In the first reading, every once in a while, a Stephen comes along, someone so dedicated to the principles which can bring us together that he is willing to surrender his life for the cause. And of course, we gladly take it. Better to sacrifice a Martin Luther King or an Oscar Romero than to lose our favored position in society!

In the gospel, Jesus prayed: "That they may be one, as we are one - I living in them, you living in me - that their unity may be complete." The goal of the entire paschal mystery, and Jesus' wish for all of us, is unity: that we may be one as Jesus and his Father are one.

Come, Lord Jesus! Come with the life-giving water that will wash away our divisions and make our unity complete. Amen.

BELOVED: A GATHERING OF WOMEN


