From Fr. Dino's Desk

THANK YOU MESSAGE

Peace and Joy to All of You. Let me begin with a beautiful dialogue from The Little Prince - a story close to my heart. As the Little Prince prepares to leave his dear friend, the Fox, they say goodbye, and the Fox shares a secret:

"It is only with the heart that one can see rightly. What is essential is invisible to the eye."

"It is the time you have wasted for your rose that makes your rose so important."

"You become responsible, forever, for what you have tamed."

That's exactly how I feel today. In the nearly two years we've spent together, we have shared something deep and invisible - something that cannot be seen by the eyes, but only felt with the heart. We have shared faith, friendship, meals, laughter, and life. You have become my "rose." And today, it is hard to leave the "rose" I have come to love. A veteran pastor once told me: "There are two moments when people are happy in the parish - when the new priest arrives...and when he leaves!" Well, I truly hope this is not one of those moments. When I first arrived here, I was a stranger. I didn't know anyone. But from the very beginning, you welcomed me with open hearts. You opened your homes, your culture, your food, your stories - and in doing so, you showed me the face of Christ.

As Jesus said in Matthew 10:40, "Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me." And Hebrews 13:2 reminds us, "Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels." In welcoming me, you welcomed not just a man from far away - you welcomed the Lord who sent him. And for that, I pray that God will bless you richly.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS


June 18th is the last meeting of the Knights of Columbus Council 10960 for this fraternal year. There are no meetings until September. See any Brother Knight for more information.

But let me also say clearly: **This was never about me.** It was the bishop who sent me - and through him, Christ Himself. I am just a servant. As Jesus taught, "When you have done all that is commanded, say: We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty." (Lk. 17:10). If my words or actions fell short at any time, I humbly ask for your forgiveness. But if something I did brought comfort, strength, or hope - then to God be the glory. As St. John the Baptist once said: "He must increase, and I must decrease." (Jn. 3:30). **Still, I want you to know how truly precious my time with you has been.** We often think time is something we spend - but in truth, it is something we offer in love. That's why one of my favorite lines from The Little Prince says, "It is the time you have wasted for your rose that makes your rose so important." Indeed, we did not waste time - we made it sacred.

I will forever treasure:

- The simple but warm Lenten dinners where we broke bread as a family in faith.
- **Pierogi making**, not only for the delicious result but for the joy and teamwork shared in the kitchen.
- Sunday and weekday worship, where we prayed and sang together united in one heart.
- **DLA fundraisers**, not just as financial efforts, but as a sign of your deep love and support for the Church and its mission.
- The dedication of our parish staff, the Pastoral and Finance Councils, the Catholic Daughters of the Americas, and the Knights of Columbus each one working quietly and faithfully.
- The wholehearted **collaboration of people across ministries** altar servers, lectors, choirs, decorators, ushers, sacristans, and so many more who made our worship beautiful and our parish life vibrant.

All of that time, given in love, was not just meaningful. It was holy. And so, I say again: **Time spent with the people we love is never wasted**. In truth, I have made a home here with you. Yes, I am going back to my homeland. But my heart is not leaving empty - it is leaving full. **Full of memories, full of gratitude, full of love**. People often said, "Father, you must be excited to go home!" And yes, of course, I miss my family and my native land. But now, **I will also miss you**. Because **God allowed our paths to cross and our hearts to meet.**

The Little Prince reminds us in French: "Tout le temps que vous passez avec un véritable ami est précieux." "All the time you spend with a true friend is precious." Indeed, our time together has been very precious to me - and I will treasure it always.

In closing, when someone leaves, people may feel joy or sadness - and I've come to realize that the feeling depends on the heart of the one who stays. From the bottom of my heart: **Thank you**. I will carry you in my prayers, in my thoughts, and in my heart. **May God bless you always**. **And in everything - may God be glorified!**
